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DEAR FRIENDS,

Thank you for making 2021 a remarkable year for DC Volunteer Lawyers Project! This year was marked by significant operational growth, which enabled us to provide 2,137 domestic violence survivors, at-risk children, and vulnerable immigrants with free legal services. This is the highest number of clients served in DCVLP's thirteen-year history.

Tragically, the need to grow our operations is reflective of the growing need in our community. Since the start of the pandemic two years ago, the demand for DCVLP's services has not slowed down. The need remains alarming both in the number of clients and the severity of their needs. Navigating the court system is very difficult and having a lawyer has never been more important.

Through the support of many generous donors, we were positioned to increase our staff in ways that allowed us to accept more cases, recruit more volunteers, and assist more clients. Our dedicated staff has done an exceptional job at expanding our reach while strengthening our programs and services. To give a snapshot of the impact we made in 2021, DCVLP:

- represented 120 at-risk children.
- served 672 clients at our legal clinics.
- accepted 465 protection order cases.
- helped 105 vulnerable immigrants seeking relief.
- represented 228 victims and their children in family law cases.
- engaged over 459 volunteer lawyers who provided \$13M in legal services.

Because of an extraordinary outpouring of support this past year, we exceeded our budgeted revenue by \$700,000. This surplus directly enabled the operational growth we experienced in 2021. Our annual revenue is comprised of a variety of sources, including the District's Office of Victim Services & Justice Grants, the DC Bar Foundation, the Mayor's Office, private foundations, 35+ law firms, and individual contributions. 84% of our overall budget goes directly to program services for our clients. Our ongoing goal is to keep our overhead low while broadening our impact in the community, and your increased investment this past year truly made this possible!

DCVLP is stronger than ever due to our continually expanding community who comes together to give their time, talent, and treasure in support of survivors and children in DC. I hope each volunteer, donor, sponsor, and individual acknowledged in this report knows that we are humbled to have you as a partner in our lifesaving work.

Thank you for wholeheartedly believing in DCVLP's vision that a life free of violence and abuse is a basic human right.

We are looking forward to much more in 2022!

Our small but experienced staff recruit, train, and support hundreds of dedicated volunteer attorneys each year to handle emergency protection order, custody and child support cases on behalf of victims, and serve as court-appointed advocates for vulnerable children living with abuse, neglect and other dangerous circumstances.

We operate free virtual and in-person walk-in clinics throughout the District so domestic violence victims and caregivers of at-risk children can access free legal services on a wide range of issues, social service referrals, crisis support, and safety planning.



OUR COMMUNITY PARTNERS

We maintain meaningful partnerships with over 30 other local organizations to provide holistic services to our clients.

DCVLP is committed to providing trauma-informed legal services that address the comprehensive needs of our clients. Our attorneys, volunteers, and advocates help clients achieve long-term safety and stability by connecting survivors and at-risk children to our community partners for assistance during and beyond the closing of their case.

Domestic violence survivors and their children frequently face job loss, food insecurity, housing instability, and limited access to quality healthcare. DCVLP's dedicated client advocates directly connect our clients to community partners for crisis response and intervention, safety planning, physical health services, substance abuse treatment, housing assistance, emotional wellness, and other critical needs.



























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

*On May 15, 2020, DCVLP received loan proceeds in the amount of \$232,500 under the Paycheck Protection Program (PPP). The promissory note calls for monthly principal and interest payments amortized over the term of the promissory note with a deferral of payments for the first six months. Under the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES Act), the promissory note may be forgiven by the Small Business Administration in whole or in part. During the year ended December 31, 2021, DCVLP expended and traced the PPP funds for purposes outlined in the CARES Act guidance and applied for full forgiveness. On January 11,2021, DCVLP received forgiveness in the amount of \$232,500.On February 24, 2021, DCVLP entered into a five-year promissory note agreement in the amount of \$227,912 with a 1% fixed interest rate under the Paycheck Protection Program. The promissory note calls for monthly principal and interest payments amortized over the term of the promissory note, unless otherwise forgiven. Under the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2021, the promissory note may be forgiven by the Small Business Administration in whole or in part. During the year ended December 31, 2021, DCVLP expended and traced the PPP funds for purposes outlined in the CARES Act guidance and applied for full forgiveness. On October 7, 2021, DCVLP received forgiveness in the amount of \$227,912.

SINCE 2008, DCVLP HAS LEVERAGED OUR UNIQUE MODEL OF PAIRING VOLUNTEERS WITH SUPERVISING ATTORNEYS TO MAXIMIZE THE IMPACT OF EVERY DOLLAR INVESTED IN OUR ORGANIZATION.

Through our supervisory model, we ensure that volunteers have all the tools and resources to successfully represent our clients. Supervisors train volunteers, review volunteers' work, accompany volunteers to court, and provide expert legal guidance throughout the life of a case.

Most importantly, our supervisory model ensures that our clients receive the best legal services possible. In the 2021 fiscal year, our supervisory model made it possible to translate \$1.8 million into 35,000 pro bono hours, worth \$13 million in free legal services.

Our 2021 revenue came from a variety of sources, including government grants, private foundations, law firms, corporate partners, and individual donors. This funding is critical to our operations and makes it possible for DCVLP to hire and retain highly qualified attorneys and program staff.

In addition to our attorneys, DCVLP is fortunate to have four full-time client advocates on staff who assist survivors and their families with their non-legal needs. In 2021, increased support from our funders allowed us to add more attorneys and advocates to our staff, bolstering our capacity to assist more clients.


We are incredibly grateful for the generosity of every funder who made it possible to help victims and children escape violence in 2021.

DOMESTIC VIOLENCE PROGRAM

The team for our Domestic Violence Program, who is **trained and experienced** in serving victims in a traumainformed manner, offers **representation** in protection order cases, family law matters, and immigration cases.

We provide **advocacy** on victims' legal rights in criminal proceedings against abusers, housing, employment, public benefits and other matters related to finances.

Our Advocates offer wrap-around services including trauma-informed crisis intervention, safety planning, and support services to ensure clients have the tools necessary to successfully escape violence and achieve safety, stability, and self-sufficiency.



Emily was continuously abused by her **husband for years.** She had filed for multiple Civil Protection Orders, but had to vacate them for various reasons, including for the financial support she had through her husband. After separating from him in 2020, Emily came to DCVLP for assistance. We immediately assigned volunteers to help her file for divorce and custody of their children. At the initial hearing, DCVLP volunteer attorneys successfully argued for a Temporary Custody Order for Emily, giving her a sense of safety to have her two children with her. Due to the pandemic, the scheduled case in May 2021 was rescheduled. While waiting for the new date, Emily's husband threatened to kill her and attempted to kidnap the children. DCLVP Volunteer Attorneys immediately helped Emily file and obtain a Civil Protection Order and provided her with criminal advocacy in a criminal case against her husband for the threats he made against her. Emily is safer due to the advocacy and efforts of DCVLP Volunteer Attorneys who helped her gain custody of her children and a Civil Protection Order against her husband.

CHILD ADVOCACY PROGRAM

We have served as court-appointed Guardians ad litem for vulnerable children living in dangerous homes since 2008. The children we serve range in age from newborn to 17 years old. Most reside in Wards 5, 7 and 8 in the District and have experienced significant trauma resulting from growing up in homes with violence and neglect.

Our lawyers conduct a thorough investigation of the child's home life, including interviewing the child, parents, other family members, teachers, counselors, medical providers, and others involved in the child's life. After a long investigation, the GALs make recommendations to the court regarding custody and visitation that is in the best interests of the child, ensuring a safe and secure home for each child.

JUDGES ADOPT OUR ATTORNEYS' CUSTODY RECOMMENDATIONS.

Noah was raised by his grandfather as his mother struggled with addiction and his father was incarcerated. When Noah was 10 years old his father was released from prison. His father obtained a stable job and home and wanted full custody of his son. Noah's grandfather and father had significant animosity toward one another, each claiming the other was abusive and neglectful. DCVLP Child Advocacy Attorneys were appointed to Noah's case to investigate these claims and identify the safest, most supportive place for Noah to live. After months of investigation, the Attorneys recognized it was in Noah's best interest to have them both in his life. They worked to build trust between the grandfather and father.

DCVLP Attorneys negotiated a custody agreement giving Noah's father primary physical and legal custody with regular visitation to the grandfather, ensuring that Noah continues to have a strong relationship with his grandfather and extended family. Noah is safe and stable, surrounded by a supportive family who has his best interests in mind.


IMMIGRATION PROGRAM

DCVLP's Immigration Program, RELIEF, is now in its third year.

Through RELIEF, we provide holistic and trauma-informed comprehensive immigration legal services to low-income immigrant victims of domestic violence or other gender-based violence and immigrant children.

Our attorneys assist with asylum claims, Violence Against Women Act selfpetitions, U-visas for victims of criminal activity, T-visas for victims of human trafficking, Special Immigrant Juvenile Status, Temporary Protected Status, Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals, work authorizations, and other immigration relief.

Our RELIEF Client Advocate helps clients navigate the social service ecosystem of the DC, connecting them to housing, food, counseling, healthcare, and other critical resources.

Abeo was sexually assaulted and repeatedly attacked because of his sexual orientation. Living in Nigeria, a country with anti-LGBTQ laws, he fled to the United States seeking Asylum. He applied alone in 2018, but the slow process of gaining asylum was only increasing his emotional and psychological trauma.

Receiving the referral from our community partner Center Global, a program of the DC Center for LGBT Community, we accepted Abeo's case. DCVLP RELIEF Attorneys requested an expedited interview due to unique humanitarian need based on extenuating circumstances relating to his emotional health and financial stability.

As a result, Abeo's interview was expedited and Abeo was successfully awarded Asylum, a critical factor in enabling him to obtain a job and begin healing from the trauma he experienced.

ACCESS TO JUSTICE THROUGH LEGAL CLINICS

Having the advice of a lawyer helps domestic violence survivors know their rights and empowers them to move toward long-term safety and stability.

DCVLP operates legal clinics four days of the week where victims, caregivers of at-risk children, and other disadvantaged residents can learn about their rights regarding protection orders, family law, immigration, criminal proceedings against their abusers, housing, employment, and public benefits.

DCVLP offers free, walk-in clinics throughout the District to make it easy for domestic violence victims and caregivers of at-risk children to speak with a caring and experienced lawyer.


